





Passage 1 (Items 31-33)

The rhesus monkey, named Darwin, became an internet sensation when he escaped from his owner Yasmin Nakhuda's car in the parking lot of the Canadian store on Sunday, and was caught on camera ambling about in a fitted sheepskin coat.

He was captured by animal control officers and moved to a primate sanctuary, but today Ms. Nakhuda said Darwin should have the right to choose, and revealed she is considering taking legal action. She claims the Japanese macaque was illegally taken away from her by the city's animal services and moved to a sanctuary in Sunderland, Ontario.

A spokesman at Animal Services said the young primate was very quiet and lacked signs of personality, which can be a sign of stress. Ms. Nakhuda said she believed the separation was wearing on him.

Passage 3 (Items 38-41)

You'll probably be reading a lot about selenium in the coming months. Soon-to-bereleased studies are expected to replicate in human's selenium's impressive cancer-prevention prowess in rats and other animals.

But the formerly obscure mineral may also be crucial for proper brain function. Although researchers haven't yet figured out its exact role, it appears selenium helps us maintain a happy, healthy mood.

The latest clue comes from a study in which 12 men, holed up in a research facility for four months, were fed either a high-or low-selenium diet. Those on the reduced-selenium regimen - - and whose initial selenium levels were low - - were more prone to depression and hostility, report biochemist Wayne Chris Hawkes, Ph.D., and clinical psychologist Linda Hombostel, Ph.D.

Though the finding fit together nicely with a British study in which selenium supplements boosted subject's moods, it's unlikely that selenium deficiency is responsible for much depression in the U.S., says Hawkes, a researcher at the USDA Agricultural Research Service. How much of the mineral you get depends less on what you eat than where the food comes from. If your fruits, vegetables, and livestock are raised in selenium—poor soil, you may be at risk of deficiency, but selenium levels are adequate in most U.S. farmland.

Not so, however, in New Zealand and parts of China, according to Hawkes. (In the USDA study, in fact, the low-selenium group was fed New Zealand beef.) In such countries, dietary selenium levels could be insufficient for optimal mood maintenance.

Selenium's importance is underscored by the fact that when the body's stock is being depleted, the brain is the last organ to give up its supply. But scientists still have little idea what the brain is doing with its stash, or why low levels would after mood. Predicts Hawkes: "It'll be at least ten years before we sort that out."
